The 5<sup>th</sup> classes and staff of Scoil Bhríde, presented Mrs Higgins with a Rose Bush aptly called 'A Poet's Wife' and some spring flowers before Caroline Keyes presented her with a poem she wrote about Sabina.

Before leaving to the cheers of almost 700 energetic children Mrs Higgins was treated to an assortment of delicious home baked treats and refreshments in the Staffroom. This day in Scoil Bhríde, Kill will certainly go down in history but more importantly the children will always remember the impact of Mrs Higgins' words of inspiration in promoting peace, care for the environment and biodiversity, promoting themselves as lifelong learners and in whatever shape or form as teachers. 
